THE TEXAS BEEKEEPING INDUSTRY

Every third bite of food consumed by the average Texan is a result of honey bee pollination. It is often thought that Honey production is the principal contribution of Texas beekeepers. As important as it is, honey production is a distant second compared to pollination provided for food (fruits, vegetables, nuts, etc.) by Texas Beekeepers' honey bee colonies.

POLLINATION

Texas produces some 90 commercial crops which require or benefit from pollination by honey bees. The estimated annual value of honey bee pollination is \$587 million; over 80 times the value of the honey produced by these same colonies.

The invaluable benefits of honey bee pollination of native plants which provide food and shelter for wildlife, reproduction of plants preventing erosion, along with backyard gardens simply cannot be measured.

SUMMARY

The Texas beekeeping industry is a small component of the large food and fiber industry in Texas. Although small in terms of numbers of individuals involved, the benefits to all Texans are enormous!
